Opportunity for Formal Public Comment

The Blue Mackerel project Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), is being assessed by Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (DCCEEW) in accordance with the decision in EPBC referral number 2025/10409.

Blue Mackerel Offshore Wind is pleased to announce the project EIS has progressed to the next stage of assessment.

DCCEEW has prepared draft tailored assessment guidelines outlining the requirements for Blue Mackerel's EIS and they will manage public comment in accordance with regulations.
